



# Energy Vulnerability Plan Report One of the main object



One of the main objectives of the Naturgy Foundation in 2021 - a year marked by the social and economic situation in Spain - was to minimise the effects of energy vulnerability. It therefore bolstered its Energy Vulnerability Plan by giving a boost to its long-standing programs and implementing other initiatives related to social innovation. In addition, Naturgy's Customer Service Area supported the Plan with several actions aimed at vulnerable customers and social entities and services.



### Social impact

Among the actions carried out by Naturgy during 2021, emphasis should be placed on the work done by Social Services, the deferral of bills and arrangements related to the social bonus.







## **Energy Rehabilitation Charity Fund**

The Energy Rehabilitation Charity Fund has become one of the foundation's fundamental tools in its fight against energy vulnerability. The immediate impact on the **habitability of the homes** where we take action, as well as its **contribution to savings** by these families, make this program a **cornerstone of the Energy Vulnerability Plan**.

# **Energy School**

The aim of both the online and in-person versions of the Energy School (when possible due to the pandemic situation) **was to provide training on energy and energy efficiency** to professionals from Social Services and social entities, as well as to people in vulnerable situations.



During this year, the School also ran webinars on energy efficiency, energy prices, contracting, the social bonus and tariffs, among other subjects.

# **Energy Volunteering**

The Energy Volunteering team was instrumental in meeting the challenges of the Vulnerability Plan. Its activity focused on providing training, personalised advice on contracting and tariffs, and support with managing the social bonus, as part of its activities with families. It also worked with young people to provide them with guidance on future careers in the energy sector, thereby preventing them from dropping out of school and bringing energy efficiency habits to groups with intellectual disabilities. Furthermore, the more social areas of volunteering were strengthened during 2021, due to the pandemic.

# Prize for the best social initiative in the energy sector

The Naturgy Foundation organised the II edition of the Award for the best social initiative in the energy sector, aimed at **highlighting** those people, entities and institutions that stand out in the **social field**, with direct or indirect links to **energy**, and helping to finance initiatives in this field to improve the quality of life of the most vulnerable people.
